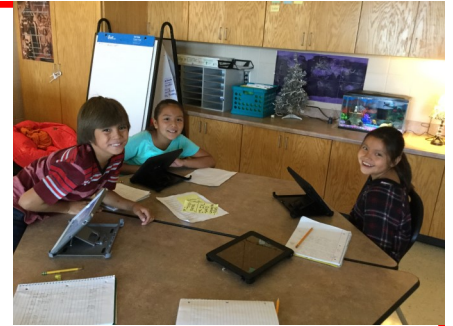
October 13th– 4th Grade Fall Celebration

5th Grade Classroom activity coming at the end of October! Stay tuned for details!



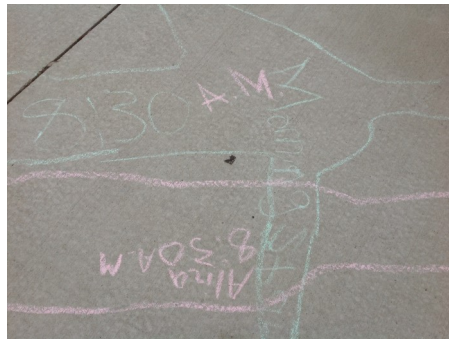
3rd graders doing work stations.

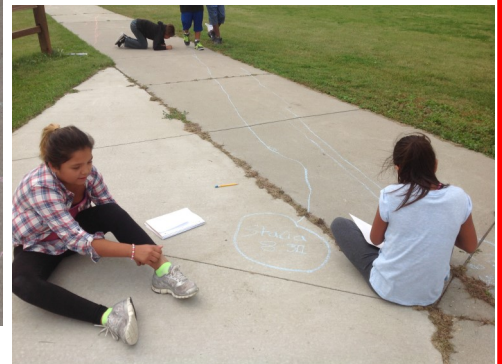
