Covid-19 Pandemic Procedures



Section 1: Prevention

➤ **Enemy Swim Day School follows the recommendations of the CDC**

| Prevention | Screenings | Social/Physical Distances | Face Coverings |

| (1) Minimize the number of people who come into contact with each other, (2) maximizing the physical distance between people, (3) reducing the time that people spend in close proximity to others, and (4) measures to minimize dispersion of droplets. | Students and staff with a temperature above 99.5 degrees or one or more symptoms are asked to stay home or may be sent home. Parents and guardians are asked to screen students for symptoms and temperatures. Students will be screen prior to entry to school. Visitors will also be screened. | All students and staff are required to limit physical interaction and practice appropriate social/physical distance. Students and staff closer than 3 feet distance must be masked. Limit class sizes: FACE: 12 students K-2 nd grade: 14 students 3 rd – 5 th grade: 15 students 6 th – 8 th grade: 16 students Bus transportation: students seated by family first, then by class. | All non-vaccinated persons will wear a face covering when not at their personal work/desk area or when in proximity of another person. All vaccinated persons will wear a face covering when they are in close proximity (less than 3 feet) of an unvaccinated person. |
| Hand Washing | Cleaning, Disinfecting, Maintenance | Food Service | Athletics/Traditional Competitions |
| Staff and students will wash or sanitize their hands before eating and after restroom use or outside recess and after the use of shared materials. | All multi- and high-touch surfaces are disinfected continuously. Every room is disinfected daily. Restrooms are checked/ serviced 4 times daily. UV Emitters on Heat Pumps. ERV's have fresh air circulating with high quality filters changed monthly. | Food Service personnel will wash their hands with soap and water before and after handling or preparing any food, as well as, prior to serving food. Students will not be allowed to share food with each other. MS Students will have breakfast in their classroom. Plastic barriers will be used for the breakfast and lunch tables. | Athletics will be held with safety precautions. Parents/ Guardians of athletes will be required to sign a liability waiver. Athletes will be required to be covid tested bi-weekly in order to keep the team safe. There may be limited capacities. Spectators will be asked to social distance at all events. |
| Field Trips | School Events/ Visitors | Training | Remote Learning |
| Educational field trips will be allowed with extra safety pre-cautions within a 90 mile radius. | School events will be held on campus following the required safety procedures. At school events, visitors are expected to stay in family groups. Visitors to the school will be required to make an appointment. Visitors to the classrooms must be fully vaccinated. | Staff and parents will be provided training to recognize symptoms and properly screen. Staff and students will be provided training on the correct use of face masks and shields, safe distancing procedures, and safeguards for protection of self. The school will provide the school stakeholders with up-to-date information on the Coronavirus Pandemic and CDC Guidelines. | Full remote learning as an alternative to in-person school will not be offered for the 21-22 school year. Students, classes, or the whole school may be remote for a period of time. During those times, students will follow the modified remote learning schedule. Students will be provided technology. Students without internet will receive a paper learning packet. Meals will be delivered any time the school is on full remote. |

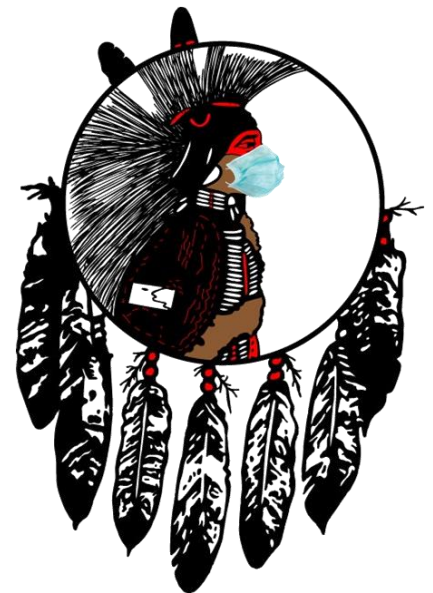
Section 2: Response to Confirmed or Suspected COVID-19 Cases and Close Contacts


- School family members may request a school Covid test (Abbot Binax Now COVID-19 Test) with signed consent

| Situation | Actions | Requirements | Additional Information |
|--|--|--|---|
| 1. Temperature above 99.5% | Stay/Send Home | Stay home until after at least 24 hours with no fever (with no fever reducing medications). | Student: Remote Learning or Medical Excused Absent Staff: Personal Leave or Telework (if appropriate) |
| 2. Positive result of COVID-19 TEST | Stay/Send Home Isolate 10 days | Stay home until after at least 10 days since symptoms first appeared; at least 24 hours with no fever (without the use of fever reducing medications) & symptoms have improved prior to return to school/work. | Student: Excused Medical Absence or Remote Learning (if appropriate) Staff: Family First Paid Leave (available until 12/30/2020) with documentation or telework (if appropriate). If isolation exceeds 10 days additional documentation is required from the SD Dept. of Health. |
| 3. SD Dept. of Health notified that you were in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 (tested positive) | Stay/Send Home Test for COVID-19 or quarantine 14 days since last contact | Check your temperature twice a day and monitor for symptoms | Staff: Telework if appropriate Students: Remote learning |

Section 3: Providing Emotional Support to Students, Teachers, and Staff

- The Coronavirus Pandemic may cause or trigger a mental or emotional disturbance that may exceed the affected ability to manage. The most common reactions include anxiety, distress and depression. These reactions may result from a fear of contracting the illness, the ability to recover from the illness or even experiencing the death of family members, colleagues or classmates. Students, educators and school administrators have a responsibility to care for themselves and each other.
- Counseling personnel will brief the staff and stakeholders on the emotional/mental (psychosocial) impact of COVID-19 on students and adults. Staff will assist in the identification of students or staff that need help when one or more of the following signs may be present:
 - Persistent fear, anxiety, sadness, hopelessness, or overwhelming emotions
 - Withdrawal, lack of energy, or loss of interest in personal appearance
 - New or excessive anger or rage
 - Other changes that have not been the norm for that student, such as increased absences, dropping out of activities, or nonparticipation in class or schoolwork
