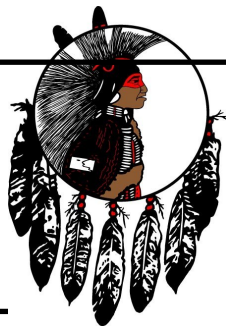

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4th Grade News

In Math, we have been learning about place value, rounding, addition, and subtraction. All of 4th grade can borrow and regroup, and we can all round to the nearest ten, hundred, thousand, ten thousand, and hundred thousand. Fourth grade completed their Unit 1 assessment, and everyone did very well on it! This week, we started Lesson 6 in Unit 2: *Understanding Multiplication as a Comparison*. I can't wait to see how our MAP scores skyrocket from the first test we took in August. We are working hard in math in the 4th-grade classroom!

In Literacy, we have been learning a lot about personal narratives and the best ways to write our own. We have a new curriculum in Literacy called Savvas. We just started Week 5 in Unit 1 and are reading a story called *Barbed Wire Baseball*. Each week, we have fun answering our weekly question. This week's question is: *How can people influence the places where they live?*

For Writing, 4th grade has already written a practice personal narrative about anything they wanted to write about. In two weeks, we will be writing a personal narrative about a time they were kind to someone. Students will need to include transition words, dialogue, an introduction, a conclusion, and organize their story in chronological order. Fourth grade is ready to write their personal narratives!

In Social Studies, 4th grade has been working on geography skills and learning how to read a road map. We learned what a map scale is and how to use it properly. We also know how to use longitude and latitude to locate places on the globe. We've learned about the Western and Eastern Hemispheres, the Prime Meridian (which divides the globe from north to south), and the Equator—and how living close to it means hot weather!
